

Governors

The school has eighteen governors, six of whom are elected by parents.

The Governing Body meets at least six times each year. There are numerous sub-committees:

- Curriculum
- Personnel
- Finance and Resources
- Health and Safety
- Visits and Trips

Each of these sub-committees meets on a regular basis and others meet as and when required.

The Governing Body sends a report to all parents during the Autumn Term. It contains information about the work of the Governing Body and the school.

Personal Property

All personal property brought into school is the responsibility of the student concerned unless the item is handed to a teacher for safe keeping. Staff cannot be expected to supervise or take any responsibility for the property of 242 students in Year 7.

We do not recommend that students bring any valuable items into school. It is for this reason that we recommend an inexpensive watch. Jewellery, apart from one stud in each ear, is not allowed in school. Students will not be allowed to wear any other jewellery for PE and so if they choose to bring anything else into school we cannot take responsibility for its safe keeping.

Any possessions and clothes should be marked with the student's name. Items which are found will be handed in to Student Reception. If students lose anything they should ask to see if it has been handed in.

Students bring mobile phones to school at their own risk. They should be marked with the student's name. An App such Find My Phone should also be installed, so that lost phones can be tracked and located.

Medical Matters

We have trained First Aid staff who are available throughout the school day. Our Student Receptionist is available to handle on-going medical care for some students.

We ask you to keep the following in mind:

- Please do not send your child to school if they are obviously ill and in need of medical attention.
- Please let the Student Receptionist know important details about any on-going medical problem. This is especially important if they are taking any medication.
- If a student needs to take medication during the day the medicine should be kept by the Student Receptionist.
- If a student is ill in school they should see their Form Teacher, class teacher or Progress Leader who will send them to the Student Receptionist.
- When the Student Receptionist has seen your child she may contact you to explain what is wrong. She may ask for you to arrange to collect your child from school. It is therefore very important that we have telephone numbers to contact you during the day.
- If an accident occurs we may need to send your child to hospital immediately (you will also be contacted) or we will recommend that you take your child to hospital.
